Building Envelope

[“Balancing Glazing, Building Envelope, and Thermal Comfort”](#), written by Lynn Petermann and Alejandra Menchaca appears in a recent issue of *High Performing Buildings* magazine. A free Glazing and Winter Comfort Tool, developed by architectural firm Payette, helps evaluate the impact of window glazing and thermal performance on occupants in winter. Although the tool may be of most interest to engineers and architects, the article explains the types of discomfort (radiant and downdraft), as well as the parameters necessary to evaluate how they are impacted.

[“Digging Deep to Cure HVAC Inefficiency”](#) is in the October 27, 2016 issue of *Energy Manager Today*, written by Carl Weinschenk. A public school in Colorado, which was built to LEED Gold, was spending much more money than expected on its HVAC system. An energy management system, installed and paired with the building automation system, was able to identify the underlying problem and allow the staff to take corrective action.

BOC Level I certification is 74 hours of training and project work in building systems maintenance. Level II certification is 61 hours of training and elective coursework in equipment troubleshooting and maintenance. Classes usually meet one or two full days a month over a period of four to six months.
