	When carpet is to be replaced, hard floor surfaces (wood, tile, terrazzo, etc.) are considered for appropriate areas	
	Hard floor surfaces are damp-dusted daily

GENERAL BUILDING CLEANING		
	Daily schedule for cleaning and maintenance.	
	Custodial closets clean, neatly organized, ventilated, and free from odors. Mop heads treated, changed and laundered	
	Brushes and sponges for toilet bowls and urinals not used for other purposes.	
	Toilets and hand sinks not used for cleaning mops, brooms, brushes, etc.	
Swimming Pools/ Therapeutic Whirlpools		
	Swimming pools are maintained and operated according to local health regulations.	
	Swimming pool chemical storage is dry and secure from student access Therapeutic whirlpools maintained properly.	
	Individuals with open sores or infections not permitted to use whirlpools.	
	Area is well-ventilated with outdoor air or has exhaust ventilation

	Hand sink available with soap and hand drying devices	
	Mechanical washing machine used with water of 130 ♣F for minimum of 8 minutes	
	Hot tumble dryer used and vented to outdoors	
	Area for soiled laundry is separate from area for clean laundry

	Exposure to concentrated cleaning products is minimized	
	Cleaning products are matched to cleaning needs Methods are used to maximize cleaning effectiveness (hot water, sponge applications, etc.)	
	Cleaning products are not over-applied or over-used only as much product as necessary is used.	
	Metering stations are available and in use.	
	Products that contain toxins, irritants, allergens and sensitizers are avoided	
	All products are resealed and securely stored immediately after use	
	Products are stored in original containers with original labels intact empty containers are not used for other purposes	
	Different cleaning products are not mixed	
	Cleaning products with little, or no, odor or fragrances are used
