- **Fleet vehicles are an incredibly important piece of our modern society and economy**
 - They deliver our packages, perform vital services, and connect us to people across the state, country, and globe
- **The industry is shifting away from fossil fuel vehicles**
 - Emissions contribute to climate change and harm public health
 - An increasing number of these vehicles are now available in cleaner and zero-emission forms

One-Time Fleet Reporting

Who must report?

Fleets with 5+ vehicles over 8,500 lbs. GVWR

*Brokers that dispatch 5+ vehicles over 8,500 lbs.
GVWR*

*Any fleets with corporate revenues exceeding \$50
million*

This includes government and commercial fleets

Rule language here: [WAC 173-423-083](#)

What information is being collected?

Number, type, and age of vehicles

Where vehicles are located

Vehicle characteristics and uses

What will this information be used for?

*Understanding what kinds of vehicles Washingtonians
rely on for their businesses*

*Better designing Ecology's policies to serve
businesses that rely on these vehicles*

Is anyone exempt from reporting?


Yes, there are three exemption categories:

- Vehicles exempt from Ecology's emission standards under [WAC 173-423-030](#)
 - E.g. military vehicles, vehicles sold for out-of-state registration and use
- Authorized emergency vehicles
 - Police vehicles, ambulances, fire trucks, etc.
 - [RCW 46.04.040: Authorized emergency vehicle. \(wa.gov\)](#)
- Vehicles awaiting sale do not need to report



I'm a fleet manager and my fleet is required to report. How do I report?

1. Begin by making a SAW Account 
2. Register for the Air Quality Portal within SAW
3. Add the Fleet Reporting Platform to your account

June 2023: Fleet Reporting Platform Opens



June-September:
Outreach and training provided to fleet owners and brokers



September 30th, 2023: Fleet Reporting Ends



2024: Results analyzed and report released
